ELA/Language Arts with Mrs. Gabbard:

Students have been quite busy researching articles and videos about *Serfs and Peasants* or *Lords and Ladies* to use in their upcoming essays. Students will be completing a five paragraph essay on Monday and Tuesday of next week. The topic has already been given to students and they have been completing preparations for this assessment. Next week, after our writing assessment, students will begin to read various monologues in <u>Good</u> <u>Masters! Sweet Ladies!</u> Students are looking forward to exploring the book and the theme of adversity in other pieces of literature.

Science with Mr. Hipps:

"Catch a Wave"

We have looked at what all waves have in common and will examine wave anatomy (properties) on Monday. This week we will begin by examining the way waves react when they encounter a medium and/or other waves. It is important that students remember the wave vocabulary as we move through each strand of this unit. For example, we will learn about reflection, refraction, and diffraction. These terms apply to waves weather a tsunami through water, or light through space.

Sound, and how humans are able to perceive it, will be a major focus. Many students are fascinated to learn that sound is not quite what they had imagined. Sound is simply a vibration.

Plate tectonics test 2 was returned yesterday (except for 5 students who have yet to finish). Several students had quite a slip form test 1 to test 2. Please encourage your student to keep up with the work, do the online Quizizz review, and pay strong attention in class. Waves is our most difficult unit, and it is full of complex vocabulary.
