Include the URL, the name of the website, the author of the website, the date you visited the site/page

2) Newspaper

Include the author of the article, the title of the article, title of the newspaper, the publication date, the page number

Include the author(s) of the article, the title of the article, the title of the magazine, the publication date, the page number
