Nobles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kept people safe when formal civil organization fell apart Offered protection by using knights 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Silk & fur used in clothes; fancy clothes as status Sons of nobles usually became knights 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lived in Keep, a building with castle in castle Homes staffed by servants had sitting rooms and bedrooms not really clean 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Men → hunting & falconry women → sewed, had children, "lady" jousting tournaments many babies did not survive didn't use utensils to eat
Knights	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> easiest way to become knight Was to be son of a noble Protected castle Practice chivalry Jousting tournaments 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Son of noble was taken to different castle at age 7 to train as page, then squire, then knight Traveled the world 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Same as nobles because were sons of nobles Wore padding under chain mail/metal armor, helmets, swords, horses 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Traveled world Protected castle Visiting Knights stayed in lower rooms of castle Avoid lying, cheating, torture Believe in justice for all Respect women Avenge wrongs
MERCHANTS	<p>Clergy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ran the church; cared for spiritual life of people; Served the people; copied books of Bible by hand; 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Religious people of the Middle Ages Rank: Pope, bishop, priests, monks, & nuns 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Roman Catholic Church → single largest unifying organization in Medieval Europe Priests → generally head of church Monks → read, wrote in Latin, scholarly, humble 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nuns → very holy; did some work of Monks or harder work
